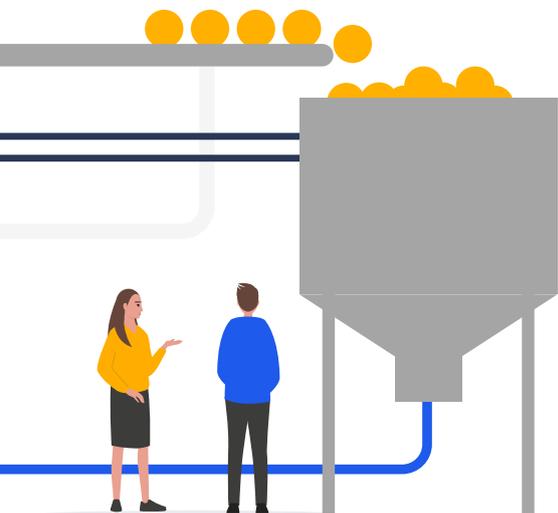


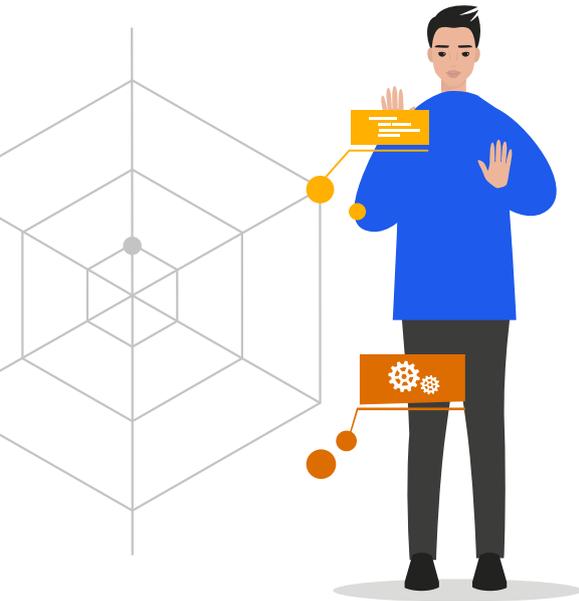
Intonation helps boost export potential for UK business
